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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 22 OF THE WILKES-BARRE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "PLANNING"

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of the City Council to pass legislation within the City of Wilkes-Barre by amending Chapter 22 of the Wilkes-Barre Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE THAT CHAPTER 22 ENTITLED "PLANNING" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

CHAPTER 30.

PLANNING

ARTICLE II.

PLANNING COMMISSION

Sec. 22-17. Composition, appointment.

The Planning Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, at least six (6) of whom shall be citizen members, and two (2) of whom are professionals in the Planning field, to be appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of City Council. The two (2) professional seats shall be filled by one (1) architect and one (1) practicing planner.

SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid part not been included.

REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed. All ordinances not specifically amended hereby remain in full force and effect.

AMENDING APPENDIX "A" OF THE CODE OF ORDINACES OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATIVE CODE."

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE THAT APPENDIX "A" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATIVE CODE" IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADD THE FOLLOWING:

DIVISION 8. PERSONNEL

Sec. 2-107. Residency

- (a) Required. All persons employed by the City of Wilkes-Barre shall be subject to their respective union contracts when it relates to residency. All members of boards, authorities, and commissions shall be residents of the city or employed in the city.
- (b) Certificate of residency. All city employees shall be required to sign a certificate of residency verifying the employee is in compliance with the employee's respective union contract.

SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid part not been included.
