**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE II. OF CHAPTER 31 OF THE
CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE ENTITLED
“SHADE TREE COMMISSION.”**

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of the City Council to pass legislation within the City of Wilkes-Barre by repealing the current Article II. of Chapter 31 of the City of Wilkes-Barre Code of Ordinances and replacing the same with a newly enacted Article II.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE THAT THE CURENT ARTICLE II. OF CHAPTER 31 ENTITLED “SHADE TREE COMMISSION” IS HEREBY REPEALED AND AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

CHAPTER 31. VEGETATION

ARTICLE II. SHADE TREE COMMISSION

CHAPTER 31. VEGETATION

ARTICLE II. SHADE TREE COMMISSION

Sec. 31-21. Right of Establishment.

The Mayor and City Council may regulate the planting, maintenance, and removal of shade trees in the city, or it may appoint a shade tree commission to administer regulations for shade trees.

Sec. 31-22. Commission Members; Appointment; Terms; Vacancies.

(a) a shade tree commission shall be composed of five members; four shall be citizen members and residents of the city and one shall be an arborist and may live or work in the city.

(b) Members of the commission shall serve three (3) year terms without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

(c) Vacancies in the office of shade tree commissioner shall be appointed by the Mayor and approved by City Council for the unexpired term.

Sec. 31-23. General Powers of Commission.

The shade tree commission has exclusive control of the public right-a-way shade trees in the city and is authorized to plant, remove, and protect shade trees on the public streets in the city, excluding city parks, state roads and private property.

Sec. 31-24. Report of Commission.

The shade tree commission shall submit an annual written report to the Mayor and the City Council.

Sec. 31-25. Grants and Fundraising.

The shade tree commission may apply for grants, receive sponsorships, and conduct general fundraising activities to support its mission to plant trees.

Sec. 31-26. Removal of Diseased or Dangerous Trees.

(a) The shade tree commission may, by giving notice, require abutting owners of the property to cut and remove trees located on the tree lawn, if the condition of the tree(s), through disease or otherwise, unreasonably affects or interferes with the health, safety, or welfare of the public or the right of the public to the unobstructed use of public roads or property.

(b) *Notice to cut/remove.* Whenever it comes to the attention of the shade tree commission that any tree(s) need to be cut and removed as set forth (a) above, a notice in writing shall be served upon the owner of the property notifying the owner of the existence of the diseased or dangerous tree and requesting its removal in the time specified in this section.

(c) *Responsibility and removal.* Upon proper notice given, the abutting owner of the property containing the diseased or dangerous tree shall be responsible for the

removal. In the event of removal and disposition by the city, the abutting owner of the property where same is located shall be liable for the expenses incurred.

(d) *Notice Procedure.* The shade tree commission (or other appropriate city designee) shall give notice of removal to the abutting property owner at least thirty (30) days before the time of compliance. It shall constitute sufficient notice, when a copy of same is posted in a conspicuous place upon the property of the abutting property owner on which the diseased or dangerous tree(s) is/are located and duplicate copies are sent by certified mail and regular U.S. mail to the abutting property owner at his/her last known address.

(e) *Content of Notice.* The notice shall contain the request for removal within the time specified in this section and the notice shall advise that upon failure to comply with the notice to remove the city or its designee shall undertake such removal with the cost of removal to be levied against the abutting owner of the property.

(f) *Removal of the diseased or dangerous tree(s) from property.* If the removal described in the notice has not been made within the thirty (30) day period of compliance, the shade tree commission (or other appropriate designee), shall cause the diseased or dangerous tree(s) to be removed.

(g) *Liability of owner or occupant.* Upon the failure of the abutting property owner on which the diseased or dangerous tree(s) have been removed by the city to pay the expenses incurred by the city for such removal, a lien shall be placed upon the property for the amount of such expenses.

Sec. 31-27. Penalties.

The shade tree commission, to the extent provided by ordinance of the city, may assess penalties for the violation of its regulations and of this article as far as it relates to shade trees. Any penalty so assessed shall be a lien upon the real estate of the offender and may be collected as municipal claims are collected.

Sec. 31-28. Disposition of Penalties.

All penalties or assessments imposed under this article shall be paid to the city.

SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid part not been included.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE THAT CHAPTER 22 ENTITLED "PLANNING" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

CHAPTER 30. PLANNING

ARTICLE II. PLANNING COMMISSION

Sec. 22-17. Composition, appointment.

The Planning Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, at least six (6) of whom shall be citizen members, and two (2) of whom are professionals in the Planning field, to be appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of City Council. The two (2) professional seats shall be filled by one (1) architect and one (1) practicing planner.

SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid part not been included.

REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed. All ordinances not specifically amended hereby remain in full force and effect.

DIVISION 8. PERSONNEL

Sec. 2-107. Residency

- (a) *Required.* All persons employed by the City of Wilkes-Barre shall be subject to their respective union contracts when it relates to residency. All members of boards, authorities, and commissions shall be residents of the city or employed in the city.
- (b) *Certificate of residency.* All city employees shall be required to sign a certificate of residency verifying the employee is in compliance with the employee's respective union contract.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid part not been included.
