- Authorizing the Mayor to accept and sign the 2023-2024 Winter Services Agreement and Exhibits on the City's behalf for Year 2 of 10.
- Authorizing the proper city officials to take any and all necessary actions related to accepting the insurance package submitted by Risk Strategies which includes, but is not limited to, Property, Inland Marine, Boiler & Machinery, General Liability, Business Auto, Fidelity Bond, Crime, Public Officials/EPLI, Law Enforcement, Firefighters Professional, Fiduciary Liability, GL & Prof. Health Depart., and Cyber Liability for a total annual premium of \$889,840.00.
- Authorizing the proper city officials to take any and all necessary actions related to awarding a contract for the Solomon Creek Emergency Wall Repairs Project, to the lowest responsible bidder, Pioneer Construction Company, Inc.
- Authorizing the proper city officials to enter into an agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and Alfred Benesch and Company to conduct supplemental design services for the North Washington Street Bridge. Alfred Benesch and Company was selected during the PennDOT ECMS Program. The allocation of funds for this program are 80% Federal, 15% State and 5% local with the local share coming from the Liquid Fuels account. The local share amount will be \$5,000.00.
- Authorizing the proper city officials to prepare and submit the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) in the amount of \$28,820.00. The purpose areas of the grant are funding for community-based and non-community based trainings, re-certification trainings, community policing and saturation patrols for violent crime areas.
- Authorizing the proper city officials to enter into an agreement with the lowest, responsible bidder, Mountain Stream Construction, in the amount of \$920,000 for the design, build, and construction, along with any or all other project documents, related to the Kirby Park Facility Building project. The allocation of funding for this project is proportionately distributed between the City of Wilkes-Barre and the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Co	ouncil of the City of Wilkes-Barre:

WHEREAS, the City of Wilkes-Barre has actively engaged in flood mitigation measures throughout the city, such as creek retaining walls repair or replacement, stormwater pump station installation, and floodgates over bridges to prevent flooding; AND

WHEREAS, an opportunity to further strengthen our flood mitigation efforts along with improve the city's Kirby Park's recreation maintenance building has arisen with the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA); AND

WHEREAS, the City of Wilkes-Barre desires to partner with the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA) to constructing a multi-use facility building in Kirby Park. The new facility will serve as the city's Kirby Park's recreation maintenance building and also serve as a secure facility to house the LCFPA's trailers that contain the Market Street Bridge Flood closure structure components. The design of the building will mimic a hangar-like facility which will allow for a direct enter and exit of vehicles and equipment through the building. The location of the facility in Kirby Park, only a quarter mile from the Market Street Bridge, would further reduce the Authority's flood fighting response time; AND

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the CITY OF WILKES-BARRE that the proper City officials are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the lowest, responsible bidder, Mountain Stream Construction, in the amount of \$\$920,000.00 for the design, build, and construction, along with any or all other project documents, related to the Kirby Park Facility Building project; AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the allocation of funding for this project is proportionately distributed between the City of Wilkes-Barre and the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA). The City's portion of \$250,000.00 will be funded by and in accordance with the Ann K. Kirby Foundation request.
