WHEREAS, the City of Wilkes-Barre has actively engaged in flood mitigation measures throughout the city, such as creek retaining walls repair or replacement, stormwater pump station installation, and floodgates over bridges to prevent flooding; AND

WHEREAS, an opportunity to further strengthen our flood mitigation efforts along with improve the city's Kirby Park's recreation maintenance building has arisen with the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA); AND

WHEREAS, the City of Wilkes-Barre desires to partner with the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA) to constructing a multi-use facility building in Kirby Park. The new facility will serve as the city's Kirby Park's recreation maintenance building and also serve as a secure facility to house the LCFPA's trailers that contain the Market Street Bridge Flood closure structure components. The design of the building will mimic a hangar-like facility which will allow for a direct enter and exit of vehicles and equipment through the building. The location of the facility in Kirby Park, only a quarter mile from the Market Street Bridge, would further reduce the Authority's flood fighting response time; AND

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the CITY OF WILKES-BARRE that the proper City officials are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the lowest, responsible bidder, Mountain Stream Construction, in the amount of \$920,000.00 for the design, build, and construction, along with any or all other project documents, related to the Kirby Park Facility Building project; AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the allocation of funding for this project is proportionately distributed between the City of Wilkes-Barre and the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority (LCFPA). The City's portion of \$0.00 will be funded by and in accordance with the TBD request and the LCFPA's portion will be funded utilizing American Rescue Plan funding.
