BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre believes municipalities should be allowed to regulate the possession of firearms on property it owns or maintains if they so choose;

WHEREAS, regulating firearms would help to protect city employees, city officials and members of the public who use city property for various purposes;

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 625 of 2019 ("SB625") was introduced by Senator Maria Collet earlier this year;

WHEREAS, SB625 would allow political subdivisions to regulate the possession of firearms on property owned, operated or maintained by political subdivisions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre hereby formally supports SB625 and recommends that it be passed and made law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE WILKES-BARRE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED "ANIMALS AND FOWL."

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE THAT CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILKES-BARRE ENTITLED "ANIMALS AND FOWL" IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADD THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE:

CHAPTER 5. ANIMALS AND FOWL

Article V. ANIMALS IN INCLEMENT WEATHER AND UNATTENDED MOTOR VEHICLES

Section 5-66. Responsibilities of owner/keeper regarding the treatment of animals during inclement weather within Wilkes-Barre City

- A. It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of any animal to leave any animal outside and unattended during a period in which a severe weather warning has been issued for Luzerne County by the National Weather Service.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any animal outside and unattended for a continuous period of time greater than thirty (30) minutes if the temperature during such period remains either entirely:
 - 1. Below thirty-two (32) degrees Fahrenheit; or
 - 2. Above ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit
- C. For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
 - 1. "Outside" shall mean the animal is subject to the weather elements, which expressly includes, but is not limited to, an animal in a securely fenced-in yard, an animal in a kennel, or an animal that is tethered or tied-out. The animal shall be considered "outside" regardless of access to an outdoor doghouse or similar structure.

Section 5-67. Enforcement Measures

- A. Enforcement of Section 5-66 shall begin by providing notification to any owner or occupant of any premises in violation of this ordinance, either personally or by posting such notice upon the premises that such owner must begin to act in compliance with this ordinance within one (1) day of receipt of such notice.
- B. Upon the failure of such owner or occupant to bring his or her situation into compliance with this ordinance within such period of time, enforcement officials are authorized to enter upon such premises and to temporarily remove such dog from the property.
 - 1. Any removed animal will be held at the Luzerne County SPCA
 - 2. The authorized individual who removes the animal from the premises shall provide notice to the owner or occupant of the date, time and reason for removal, and where the animal has been taken.
 - 3. Prior to any hearing regarding the violation, such animal owner may regain possession of any confiscated animal prior to a hearing when the following conditions are met:
 - A) Providing proof of ownership
 - B) Payment of all costs associated with impoundment; and
 - C) The signing of an affidavit stating that the owner understands the ordinance and agrees to maintain compliance.
 - 4. No confiscated animal shall be considered surrendered to the confiscating party unless expressly surrendered, in writing, by the animal owner of his or her own volition.

Section 5-68. Animals Left in Unattended Motor Vehicles

- A. No person shall leave or confine an animal in any unattended motor vehicle under conditions that endanger the health or well-being of an animal due to heat, cold, lack of adequate ventilation, or lack of food or water, or other circumstances that could reasonably be expected to cause suffering, disability, or death to the animal.
 - 1. Nothing in this section shall prevent a police officer, or an animal control officer from removing an animal from a motor vehicle if the animals safety appears to be in immediate danger from heat, cold, lack of adequate ventilation, lack of food or water, or other circumstances that could reasonably be expected to cause suffering, disability, or death to the animal.

- 2. A police officer, or animal control officer who removes an animal from a motor vehicle shall take it to the Luzerne County SPCA or other place of safekeeping or, if the officer deems necessary, to a veterinary hospital for treatment.
- 3. A police officer, or animal control officer is authorized to take all steps that are reasonably necessary for the removal of an animal from a motor vehicle, including, but not limited to, breaking into the motor vehicle, after a reasonable effort to locate the owner or other person responsible.
- 4. A police officer, or animal control officer who removes an animal from a motor vehicle shall, in a secure and conspicuous location on or within the motor vehicle, leave written notice bearing his or her name and office, as well as a contact phone number, and the address of the location where the animal can be claimed. The animal may be claimed by the owner only after payment of all charges that have accrued for the maintenance, care, medical treatment, or impoundment of the animal.
- 5. This section does not affect in any way existing liabilities or immunities in current law or create any new immunities or liabilities.
- B. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit the transportation of horses, cattle, pigs, sheep, poultry or other agricultural animals in motor vehicles designed to transport such animals for agricultural purposes.
- C. For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
 - 1. "Unattended" shall mean any animal left in a motor vehicle when the owner is not present.

Section 5-69. Violations and penalties

Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof in an action brought before a Magisterial District Judge in the manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$300 and not more than \$1,000, plus costs. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day or part of each day during which a violation occurs or continues. Each day that a violation of this ordinance continues or each section of this ordinance which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.

SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions shall be unaffected thereby. It is the intention of the Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid part not been included.
