PRESENTATIONS BY COUNCIL MEMBERS

Mr. Barrett asked to meet with the Administration on the situation (growth and the lack of development) at Pine Ridge Development.

Ms. Gilbert said she has been getting complaints about yard waste and recycling not being picked up on time. She asked if DPW is behind on collections again.

Mr. Wampole explained that they were a little behind because of the 4th of July holiday, but he thought they were caught up now. He said he will check into.

Ms. Gilbert said she received questions regarding maintenance on Public Square. She said that there has been DPW employees there every day for the past week or so and was wondering if it is necessary.

Mr. Wampole replied that there is one person assigned there daily.

Ms. Gilbert asked why someone needs to be there every day.

Mr. Wampole said there is enough work for DPW to do there. The employee may not be there the whole day, but it is his primary assignment.

Mr. Belusko asked Ms. Zaykowski for an update on Solomon Creek.

Ms. Zaykowski said the Administration is still reviewing some information and will have an update on Monday.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Jim Burden, Wilkes-Barre, PA appeared before Council relative to 428 East Northampton Street (trash), purchasing the vacant lot at 57 Taft Street, potholes on East Northampton Street, Grant Street and South Street and replacing the mirror on Vulcan Lane.

Mr. Wampole told Mr. Burden that the city does not own 57 Taft Street, so therefore cannot sell it to him. The city put a lien on the property for the demolition.

Ms. Gilbert told Mr. Burden that she would discuss 57 Taft Street and 428 East Northampton Street with him after the meeting.

Mr. Wampole informed Council that the Administration met with the Engineer for Solomon's Creek today. There are some concerns with the scheduling of the contract. The Administration is following up on it and will have more information on Monday.

There being no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned at 6:20 p.m.
