October 26, 2023

The City Council of the City of Wilkes-Barre met in Regular Session on October 26, 2023, at 6:00 p.m., in City Council Chambers, City Hall, Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of general business.

The meeting was organized with Chairperson Mike Belusko in the Chair.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given.

Council member Bill Barrett read the opening prayer.

Whereas, the City of Wilkes-Barre publicly advertised for bids on October 6, 2023, for the demolition of 493 South Franklin Street.

PRESENTATIONS BY COUNCIL MEMBERS

Mr. Marconi asked the Administration to look at the patch job done on North Washington Street.

Mr. Barrett said that since school went back into session there have been concerns about traffic in East End around Mackin School (between Chapel and Hillard Street). The neighbors around the school are very concerned. The problem was referred to the Traffic Committee and they kicked it back to the School District saying it is their problem. Mr. Barrett said he is going to send it back to the Traffic Committee suggesting that they study making Chapel and Hillard Streets one-way streets to alleviate the problem.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

<u>Dan Shission, co-owner of Abide Coffeehouse, 23 W. Market Street, Wilkes-Barre, PA appeared before Council to thank the City of Wilkes-Barre for their support and to discuss coordinating with utility companies working in the city (ripping up newly paved streets and road closures).</u>

Mr. Brooks asked what can be done to impose on the utilities that they notify everyone on the street of what they are doing/when they are doing it, and marking up the street twenty-four hours before they are going to do work.

Linda Joseph, Wilkes-Barre, PA appeared before Council relative to utility companies digging up newly paved streets, the opening of Keystone Mission, groundbreaking for Brian's House, Halloween Party at the Evangelical Church (South Main Street) and the Rolling Mill Hill Halloween Party.

<u>Bob Kadluboski, Wilkes-Barre, PA appeared before Council relative to the Tom Greco</u> (the Mines) lawsuit (hire an independent lawyer).

Sam Troy, Wilkes-Barre, PA appeared before Council relative to the former Coughlin High School, planting trees, tree vandalized in front of Kirby Health Center, and the budget (raises).

A moment of silence was held for the victims of the mass shooting in Maine.

There being no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned at 6:34 p.m.
